







What is this document about?



This Easy Read document is about getting support with the cost of **renting**.



Renting is when you pay money to live in a place that belongs to someone else.

The money you pay is called rent.



This information is from **Ministry of Social Development – Te Manatū Whakahiato Ora.**



In this Easy Read document

Ministry of Social Development –

Te Manatū Whakahiato Ora is

called MSD.



MSD offers support so you can:

- get a private rental home
- stay in a private rental home.



A **private rental** is a type of place you live in where you pay rent.



The private rental could be:

- a house
- an apartment
- a flat
- a townhouse.



What can MSD do?






You can talk with MSD if you need assistance / help with paying:





- housing costs like:
 - furniture






o moving.



You do not have to be on a benefit to get assistance.

You may be able to get assistance if you are on a **low income**.







The assistance MSD can give you will depend on:



things in your life like:



if you have a job 0



where you live 0



if you have children 0



your health 0



if you are disabled 0

what money you get paid

- your assets.



Assets are things you own like:

- money in your bank account
- a bach / holiday home
- a caravan / campervan.



MSD can also give assistance to:

- students
- people over 65 years of age.



MSD includes:



• Work and Income



• StudyLink.



Work and Income supports people:

- on low incomes
- who do not have a job.

Getting assistance with rent



You may be able to get a regular payment called **Accommodation Supplement**.



The **Accommodation Supplement** can assist with your payment of rent.



Accommodation Supplement is not available to people who live in **public housing**.



Public housing is houses for people where the Government pay part of the rent.

There is also a payment called **Temporary Additional Support** if you need more assistance with:

- rent
- other important living costs like:
 - childcare 0
 - furniture 0
 - home appliances. 0

Temporary Additional Support can be paid for up to 13 weeks at a time.

Getting assistance with overdue rent



There are things you can do if you are behind with paying your rent.



You can talk with your **landlord** or their **agent**.

Your **landlord** is the person who owns the home you are renting.



An **agent** is the person who manages the home you are renting on behalf of the landlord.



Your landlord or their agent may make a plan with you to pay back the rent you owe.



If your landlord or their agent says they cannot do this MSD may be able to assist you instead.



You may be able to get a **Rent** Arrears Grant.



Rent Arrears Grant is money MSD lets you borrow so you can pay the rent you owe.



You will have to pay this borrowed money back to MSD.

Getting assistance with bond and rent in advance



When you find a home to rent there is money you pay to the landlord before you move in.

This money includes:







- bond
- rent.





A **bond** is money you pay the landlord as a promise that you will not damage the home.

Your landlord can keep the bond if you do not pay your rent.



MSD may be able to assist you to pay these things.



There is the:

- Bond Grant
- Rent in Advance Grant.



This is money MSD lets you borrow.



You will have to pay the borrowed money back to MSD.

Getting assistance with moving house



MSD may be able to give you a **Moving Costs Grant**.



Moving Costs Grant is for things like the cost of hiring a:

- trailer
- truck.



The Moving Costs Grant can also be used to hire people to help you move house if you cannot do it yourself.



This is money MSD lets you borrow.





You will have to pay the borrowed money back to MSD.


Assistance getting a rental property



MSD knows it can be hard to find a place to live because of things like:



• the language you speak





- you have had problems with money
- something else.



Crimes are things people do that:

- break the law
- you can be arrested for.



A crime can be things like:

- hitting someone
- stealing something.




MSD may be able to assist by giving you a **Tenancy Costs Cover** letter.



A **Tenancy Costs Cover** letter is for your landlord to show you have support from MSD to rent a property.

Getting the right documents together



Get together your important documents before you apply for assistance.



These documents include:

- proof of who you are like your:
 - birth certificate
 - o driver licence
 - passport



- how much money you get paid
- how much money you have in the bank.















- information about what you need assistance for like:
 - overdue rent 0
 - moving costs
- your tenancy agreement.

- in person
- by phone.

Apply in person




You can visit the Work and Income centre which is closest to where you live.

o 6pm



If you are **working age** call:

0800 559 009



Working age means you are a person aged between:

• 18 years

and

• 65 years.



If you are a student call:

0800 88 99 00



If you are a **senior citizen** call:

0800 552 002



A **senior citizen** is a person aged over 65.



If you have a Youth Coach talk to them instead.



A person with a Youth Coach gets the:

• Youth Payment

or




Young Parent Payment.
